

## FOOTBALL DEVELOPMENT 2009



BHASVIC's Football development course gives students the opportunity to play Football, develop their skills, knowledge and understanding of the game. The programme runs along side the extensive range of academic studies. AS,A2, BTEC Sports Science, Level 3 Award in Sport, Level 2 First Diploma in Sports performance, and next year the level 1 course. Students will have three hours a week delivered by highly qualified teaching staff. The programme will consist of video analysis, skill development training and coaching skills.

Not only do we strive to improve the students ability to perform as a player, but seek to improve their ability to coach. The students will be able to achieve their **FA level 1** coaching award at the end of the course. This is due to staff being qualified assessors as well as excellent coaches. This in turn can lead to work in coaching (e.g. - BHAFc community work).

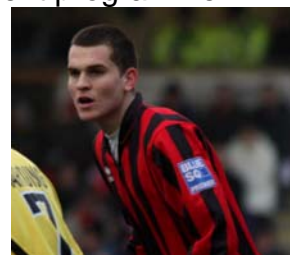
OFSTED 2007 states that "The overall pass rates particularly at level 3 are high, with many subjects achieving high grades at both A2 and AS."

**Success** For the last several years BHASVIC has consistently had students **represent England** at 18 schools or U19 college level.

**BHASVIC** are the only team in Sussex to get to the National Colleges Final. This was a competition started with over 350 teams across the country.

**County team** Of the 2007 county schools team eight BHASVIC students were in the team that won the National county schools competition.
