



A1 to A2 transfer process



• Students join a **specialist tutor group** to support their progression pathway and application process:

Medical Careers; Visual Arts; Oxbridge UCAS/gap year; Apprenticeships/Employment

- They choose how to make up their final year Study
 Programme to support their progression route:
 - Portfolio course (25+ hours)
 OR
 - Work Experience (25+ hours)

Summer Term – building a personal statement

Summer term is an important preparation time for starting this process:

- Careers Enrichment Day -7th July
- Creative Arts Festival
- Residential field trips



Progression Routes - Specialist routes

Specialist Application Evening – Tuesday 5 May, 19:00 to 20:00:

- Apprenticeship or Employment

- Visual Arts foundation course or students who wish to apply directly to a Visual Arts degree course (such as Art and Design, Photography, Textiles, Fashion, Graphic Design, Illustration, etc.)
- Oxford or Cambridge university
- Applications to Music & Dance conservatoires
