What is Clearing?
If you do not get the grades needed for your firm or insurance choices, you will be notified on Results Day by UCAS that you are now in Clearing. In 2023, 67,990 students gained a university place via Clearing according to UCAS. You can also use Clearing if you no longer wish to go to your firm or insurance choice. 32% found a place after declining their original firm choice - this is the largest single pool. 30% found a place after not meeting the terms of their offer and being released into Clearing on results day. The remainder either applied directly into Clearing with no previous UCAS application.



CLEARING CHECKLIST

Step 1: Research courses and universities Before results day

- Identify courses and universities that interest you.
- Make a list of their entry requirements.
- Note down their clearing contact details and opening hours (you can use our clearing contact form to help with this).

Step 2: Get your key documents Before results day

- Your UCAS personal ID and login details.
- A list of your qualifications and grades.
- A copy of your personal statement and any references.

Step 3: Prepare for Results Day Before results day

- Ensure you have a quiet, organised space with good internet access, your phone, and all necessary documents.
- Practice the call you will have with universities. Rehearse how to introduce yourself and discuss your interest in the course, plus prepare answers to common questions they might ask (you can use our template clearing script to help with this).

Step 4: Check UCAS track On results day

- Log in early to see if your status has changed and if you've been accepted to your firm or insurance choices.

Step 5: Receive your results On results day


- Collect your results from school or online.
- Compare your grades to the entry requirements of your firm and insurance choices. If you're not accepted by your firm or insurance choice, start the clearing process.

Step 6: Start calling universities On results day

- Have your personal ID, results, and questions ready (plus don't forget the template script that we have provided and the list of numbers that you've already prepared).
- Begin with your top-choice universities.
- Be ready to take notes during the call and be prepared for them to ask you questions about our grades, interest in the course, and future aspirations


Step 7: Confirm your choice on UCAS track On results day



The below template is an imagined conversation that could take place between you and a member of the admissions team when you call the Clearing hotline for any university on Results Day. The red text can be changed out for your own information. Please note that conversations may be different on the day, but don't panic, everyone is there to help you get into the best course for you!

University Representative: Good morning, Clearing hotline, this is Jane. How can I help you?

Student: Hi, Jane. My name is Alex Taylor. I received my A-level results today and I'm interested in the **Biomedical Sciences and Biochemistry** courses. I got a B in Biology, and Cs in Chemistry and Mathematics. I faced some challenges this year but learned a lot about resilience and time management.

University Representative: Thank you, Alex. Let me check our vacancies. [Pause] We do have vacancies in both **Biomedical Sciences and Biochemistry**. Why are you interested in these courses?

Student: I'm passionate about how the human body works at a molecular level. Your university's strong emphasis on research and state-of-the-art facilities really appeal to me. I'm excited about hands-on research projects, especially in genetics and cell biology.

University Representative: That's great to hear. You meet our entry requirements for both courses. What are your career ambitions?

Student: I aim to work in **medical research, focusing on genetic diseases**. The **molecular biology and pharmacology** modules align perfectly with my goals. Your collaborative environment and opportunities to work with leading researchers are also very appealing.

University Representative: You have a clear vision, Alex. We'd be happy to offer you a place in either **Biomedical Sciences or Biochemistry**. Do you have any questions about the courses or the university?

MYTHS ABOUT CLEARING

- 1 CLEARING IS ONLY FOR STUDENTS WHO DIDN'T DO WELL.**
Clearing isn't about your grades—it's about finding the right fit! Many students use it to switch courses or explore new options after exceeding their predictions. Universities love the flexibility and enthusiasm of students who dive into clearing!
- 2 CLEARING IS COMPLICATED**
Clearing might sound intimidating, but it's actually pretty simple! Start by checking your eligibility on UCAS Track, then reach out to universities to chat about available courses. With a bit of prep and a list of your top picks, you'll find that clearing is a breeze and totally doable.
- 3 CLEARING IS FOR STUDENTS WHO DIDN'T GET ANY UNI OFFERS**
Clearing is for anyone without a university place after results day. This includes students who turned down offers, didn't meet the offer conditions, or did better than expected and want new choices. It's a flexible process for all students looking for the right course.
- 4 CLEARING COURSES ARE RUBBISH**
Clearing courses are just as good as any other! Many top universities offer great courses through clearing. These are high-quality programs with some spots still open, offering excellent academic and career opportunities.
- 5 THERE WON'T BE ANY PLACES LEFT BY THE TIME YOU GO THROUGH CLEARING**
Universities know that there will be lots of students applying through clearing so they set aside places, and new spots often open up as students finalize their choices. Act fast and stay proactive—there are plenty of opportunities waiting for you!

Degree Apprenticeships

What is a degree apprenticeship?

Degree apprenticeships are aimed at college leavers as an alternative route into higher education. Apprentices will combine full-time work for an industry leading company with part-time university study. These courses last between one and four years, with a Bachelors or Masters degree waiting at the end.

Degree apprenticeship programmes have been developed through a collaboration between employers and higher education institutions. With government backing, the concept is to train a highly skilled workforce for key industries. <https://www.rta.gov.uk/degree-apprenticeships>

Advantages:

- No tuition fees and earn a salary
- Work experience
- Learning on the job (practical application)


Things to consider:

- How long are you tied in to work for the company for after you complete your course? Sometimes this can be beyond the time it takes to complete the training.
- Look at locations of offices online. Where are the opportunities based?
- Do they provide support to find accommodation? Some schemes may offer support but many do not.
- Will your salary cover living costs and accommodation if not local?
- What degree apprenticeships are there in the local area?
- Some schemes may ask for UCAS points



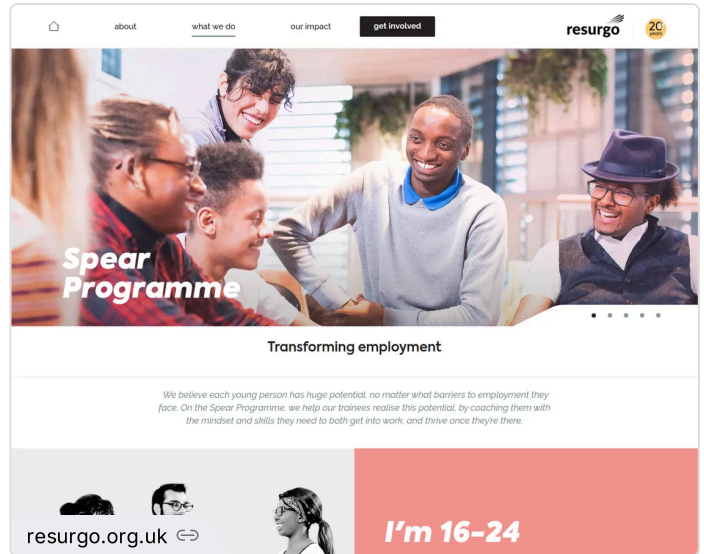

Foundation Years

A Foundation Year is designed for students who have the ability to study for a degree but don't have the required qualifications to enter directly onto an honours degree.

It therefore attracts many students from non-traditional educational backgrounds and under-represented groups.

Once you have passed the Foundation Year you can apply to progress onto Year 1 of appropriate linked honours undergraduate degree.

A number of universities now offer these additional years to students in order to allow them to overcome barriers, potentially change direction or to take the additional time they need to reach the required standards.

Pros

- Allows students access to higher tariff universities
- Allows students to change their academic pathway e.g. science based to humanities
- Allows students time to improve their study skills/ make transition to uni
- Allows students who have had significant barriers to education an opportunity to progress
- The content of a Foundation Year may be quite broad; e.g. Social Sciences rather than Sociology; this allows the student to explore alternatives before committing to a degree programme.

Cons

- Extra year of fees and maintenance costs – students should consider a 3rd year of free level 3 education or some other route if this cost is prohibitive.
- Foundation years are not available at all universities or for all subject areas so the student will be more limited in their choices.
- An extra year of study is involved, unless the student needs to do a 3rd year in FE anyway.
- If the students do not manage to complete the Foundation Year successfully then they will have incurred debt but not achieved any qualifications

Alternatives

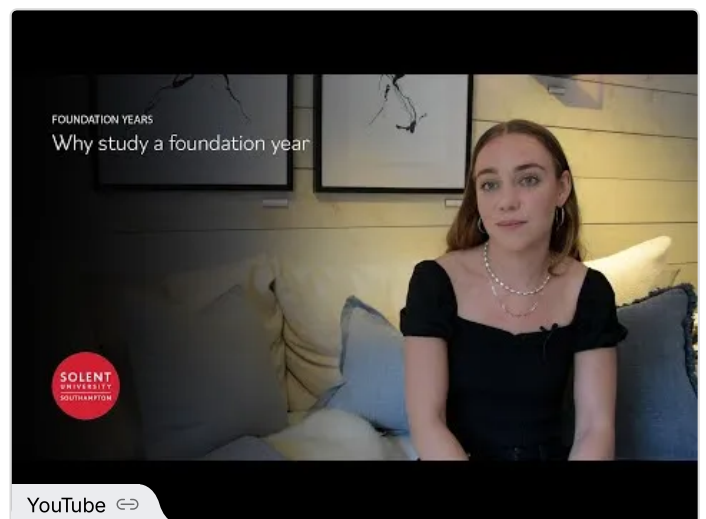
- 3rd year free education – gain extra qualifications
- Reapply with achieved grades – some universities may allow a grade slip
- Resits – new system may mean that they will have to take the second grade - a risk if it is lower
- Foundation degree – opportunity to top this up to a full undergraduate degree but not offered everywhere. (A foundation year is different to a foundation degree, a foundation degree is 2 years long, can be funded through student finance but is a more vocational qualification, for more information see <http://fd.ucas.com/FoundationDegree/About.aspx>)
- Access courses – costs involved if you already hold a level 3 qualification, this is usually only available to students over the age of 19 but it is worth checking with local providers to see if they are able to offer any flexibility.
- Mature students – may be allowed in with lower grades if they have relevant experience.

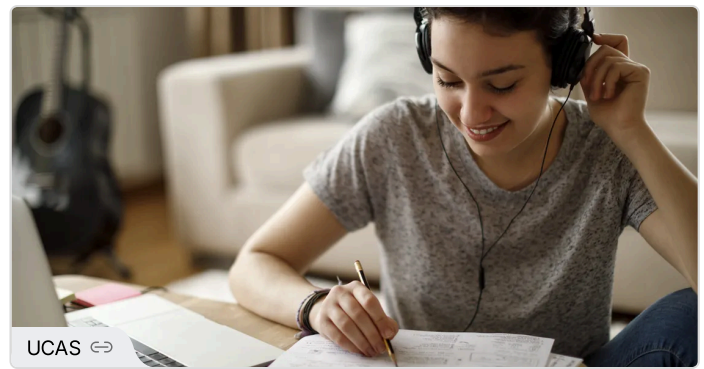

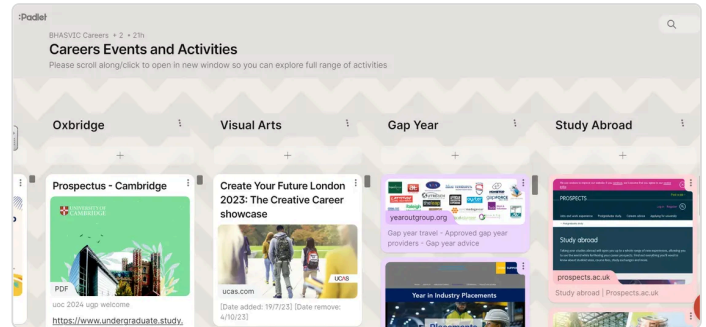
