

# Construction Newsletter Nr 4.



## RELEVANT INFORMATION, WORKS UPDATE

To provide an update on the works progression the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor slab concrete was poured on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of March with the next and last big pour scheduled for the 16<sup>th</sup> of March. Mechanical and Electrical work has also commenced on the Ground Floor along with the Partition work that is also progressing on the ground and 1<sup>st</sup> floor. Scaffold has been erected on the South, East and West side with debris netting applied to the South side Old Shoreham Road.







With all the storms that we recently have been subjected to you might have seen that the site Tower Crane does move and follow the wind direction, this is perfectly normal and called 'weathervaning'



Scaffold netting on the south side of the building and Partitions commenced on the ground floor and progressing to the 1<sup>st</sup> floor. 3<sup>rd</sup> floor slab has been poured and shuttering for the Stairs are now being lifted into place for the final walls

### **KEY DATES**

March: Scaffold will be complete around the building; this includes loading bays to all floors.

March: Roofers will begin the water protection on the balconies and will follow on from there to the roof.

Middle of March: Concrete pour to the roof.

Middle of March: Curtain walling will commence to the south side Old Shoreham Road

We will provide regular updates during construction and will provide further letter drops/updates prior to any works which may affect the surrounding vicinity of the site.


#### SAFETY
