Access to University Schemes

If your son/daughter is beginning their research in to university options then it is important to remember that, as a widening participation student, there may be further support available to them. Some universities will alter their entry offer for WP students, whilst others may offer transition support or bursaries.

Widening participation to medicine - BSMS - Summer School

Brighton and Sussex Medical School is pleased to open applications for the 2018 *BrightMed 12x3* event. We realise that many young people decide they want to pursue a career in medicine during Year 12, and so BSMS is running a 3-day condensed Year 12 event called *BrightMed 12x3* over the weekend of 6th-8th July 2018. This is open to Year 12 students and those in Year 13 who haven't been able to secure a place to study medicine first time round.

UCL is hosting two Year 12 Gateways Conferences in July 2018. Based around a central theme, each day offers Year 12 students a taste of university life. These one-day events, which take place on UCL's Bloomsbury campus, present students with a fantastic opportunity to learn about a range of different subjects, meet like-minded peers and live a day in the life of a university student. The conferences also provide an opportunity for students to receive advice on applying to competitive universities such as UCL, as well as the chance to ask our current students about their experiences at university.

The themes for the July conferences are:

There is no charge for these events, and refreshments and lunch will be provided.

Access to Southampton is designed to provide additional admissions consideration and support to eligible students. Benefits for successful students include:



- Attendance at a residential summer school, where students receive advice and guidance about higher education, as well as spend time taking part in subject specific lectures, seminars, workshops or labs.
- Insight into studying at a Russell Group University, through completion of an undergraduate style academic assignment
- Mentoring support from a current University of Southampton student
- Additional consideration in the admissions process when applying to Southampton
- £1000 scholarship in the first year of study
