Subject: Progression Day for A1 Students (UCAS Tutorial Option)

Dear Student,

During A1 – A2 transfer, you opted to join a **UCAS** tutor group during the 2018-19 academic year. An **important** and **compulsory** part of the transition into your A2 year is attending **Progression Day** on **Thursday 14**th **June**.

As you have selected this tutorial option, your Progression Day will be hosted by the **University of Sussex** at their **Falmer campus**. You will attend a series of information sessions which will help with your preparation for making an application to university level study, followed by a 'taster talk' which will give you an insight into university life and the teaching methods used by academics.

You will need to select your taster talk in advance and can do so by completing the **Progression**Day Survey Monkey which will be texted out to you within the next week two weeks. This link will also then be available on the front page of the VLE. Please ensure you complete the survey by the deadline given in the text.

Spaces at taster talks will be allocated on a first come, first served basis. You will be asked to select your top three choices and we will do our best to ensure you are able to attend your first choice. However, regardless of the topic, all of the taster talks will give you an experience of a university study environment.

You will be expected to make your own way to and from the university. The event will begin promptly at 11:00. You will need to arrive between 10:30 and 10:50 and should make your way to the Jubilee Lecture Theatre to register. Progression Day at the University of Sussex Additional Information

Getting There

All students are expected to make their own way to and from the university. The university is well-connected by train, bus and road and also has on-site facilities for cyclists.

- Train: The University of Sussex can be reached from both Brighton and Lewes train stations. You need to get to Falmer station which is directly opposite the university campus and walk through a subway which runs under the A27. Make sure you follow signs for the University of Sussex (the University of Brighton also has a campus at Falmer). Student ambassadors will be on hand to help direct you. They are easy to spot as they will be wearing bright green t-shirts.
- Car: Parking on campus is limited so we strongly advise against travelling by car. However, if someone else is dropping you off, please ensure that you have a campus map on you / your phone so you can make your way safely to the Jubilee Lecture Theatre from wherever you are dropped off.
- **Bus:** The 23, 25, 25C, 28 and 29 buses all stop at the university campus. Some 5B and 50 services also run to the campus. You can find more information and timetables about these services at www.buses.co.uk
- **Bike:** There is plenty of bike parking at the campus. Please ensure you leave you bike safely secured in a designated area as neither BHASVIC nor the university can accept responsibility for any damage or loss.

Arrival & Registration

Rooms for the taster talks will be confirmed on the day. After the taster talk, you can either join an optional student-led campus tour or make your way home. If you do wish to join the campus tour, you will be collected from your final room by a student ambassador.

All students are expected to make their own way home when they have finished at Sussex. There is no need to return to College after the event. Please ensure you are carrying your BHASVIC ID card for the duration of your visit to Sussex.
