


Helpsheet - Completing your UCAS Apply form 22

EX-STUDENTS

IMPORTANT Information:

- Your Apply form is where we will add your reference and grades achieved, send off to UCAS who will then send off to universities.
- Your choices are NOT ranked and go off to each university individually – they do NOT see your other choices.
- Ex-students - we would expect most of your applications to have been processed by the end of November (to allow for the Xmas break when college is closed).
- You can change a choice within 14 days of the welcome email from UCAS then you are stuck with them. Only add what you are sure you might actually consider and you can add 1 at a time.
- General office can take up to 10 working days to process once you have PAID.
- Please check your emails regularly. We may need you to make changes.
- Jane Cooley looks after ex-students ucasreferences@bhasvic.ac.uk. She will be able to help you with ULN and BTEC numbers.
- For a personal statement check which we are happy to do email he@bhasvic.ac.uk. We are happy to also to give advice and guidance to ex-students.

- Your apply form is much the same as current students but you will choose the ex-students category rather than a tutor group, use your correct study dates and include grades achieved.
- **IMPORTANT: if you are re-sitting any exams they MUST be included** (otherwise unis will NOT know you are re-sitting). To do this you add BHASVIC again in as a part time college (so twice) you can use May-June 23 as dates of attending, and add the re-sit subject, date and pending.
