Dear Parents/ Carers

Running alongside the curriculum BHASVIC aims to provide enriching trips linked to students' studies that not only bring their studies to life but also encourage independence and an opportunity to make new friends and have new experiences.

As part of A level History (Modern) A Level, we are hoping to run a four-day residential trip to Berlin & Potsdam in early July 2026. We expect the cost to be approx. £950. We have yet to decide on the itinerary for 2026, but this is our 2025 itinerary to give you a taster:

Return flights to Berlin.

Coach transfers from Berlin Airport

3-nights Bed & breakfast accommodation

Lunch and Evening Meals

Travel Insurance

Visit to Stasi Museum / Mall of Berlin / Sachsenhausen Memorial and Museum / Lindenstrasse Memorial / Berliner Fernsehturm / East Side Gallerr / German Resistance Memorial Centre / Gedenkstatte Deutscher Widerstand

If your young person is interested in joining this trip, you do not need to do anything at this stage. We will contact students and parents/carers in the Autumn term with all the finalised details, but we wanted to let you know about this opportunity as far in advance as possible, so you have time to financially plan if you wish.

All payments for trips are through our BHASVIC ParentPay account, you will be sent details on how to activate your account once your young person has enrolled, we encourage you to set your account up as soon as possible on receipt of these details to avoid any delays later.

Please be aware that students can only partake in a residential that is organised by the department/s that their courses fall under and that due to the number of students / residential places ratio, students will only be able to apply for one residential. Students are chosen by random selection.

We hope that you have a lovely summer, and we will be back in touch with more details of this trip in the autumn.
