Jersey Residential Trip Humanities Department Skills Weeks – early July 2026

Dear Parents/ Carers

Running alongside the curriculum BHASVIC aims to provide enriching trips linked to students' studies that not only bring their studies to life but also encourage independence and an opportunity to make new friends and have new experiences.

For the last few years we have run a six-day residential trip to Jersey for A level Geography students. This trip will explore themes relevant to their course and encourage students to explore destinations closer to home, with less environmental impact. We expect the cost for this trip to be around £800. We have yet to decide the itinerary for the 2026 trip but here's a taster of a past itinerary:

Travel - Return journey from BHASVIC to Poole and return ferry from Poole to Jersey. Cycle Hire. Full-board accommodation at Jersey Accommodation & Activity Centre Exploring Jersey's coastline & beaches on bike via the cycle network Coasteering expedition at Bouley Bay Sea Safari excursion to Ecrehous reef Visits to Jersey Wetland Centre / Durrell Zoo (both with conservation / climate change talks Explore St Helier/ Liberation square. Visit Jersey War Tunnel & Mont Orgueil

Activity afternoon – volleyball & banana boat ride at St Brelade's bay

If your young person is interested in joining this trip, you do not need to do anything at this stage. We will contact students and parents/carers in the Autumn term with all the finalised details, but we wanted to let you know about this opportunity as far in advance as possible, so you have time to financially plan if you wish.

All payments for trips are through our BHASVIC ParentPay account, you will be sent details on how to activate your account once your young person has enrolled, we encourage you to set your account up as soon as possible on receipt of these details to avoid any delays later.

Please be aware that students can only partake in a residential that is organised by the department/s that their courses fall under and that due to the number of students / residential places ratio, students will only be able to apply for one residential. Students are chosen by random selection.

We hope that you have a lovely summer, and we will be back in touch with more details of this trip in autumn.
