A1 Return to Timetable

We welcome our A1 students back to normal timetable on Monday 15 May following their Summer Exams. They are scheduled to receive their results on Thursday 15 June. There will be a chance for re-sits on 20/21 June and re-sit results are released on 28 June. A1 Progression Week: 22-27 May

This week is for all first-year students, when normal timetable is suspended to enable students to make progress in researching their preferred next steps after BHASVIC. **For all students there will be timetabled activities starting on Monday 22 May, with a combination of in-person and online sessions, which students are expected to attend.** Progression Week activities vary depending on which tutorial pathway students have chosen for next year (Visual Arts, Employability and Enterprise, Oxbridge (early applications),

Medical Careers (early applications), or UCAS) and students will be given the full schedule in tutorial next week.

A2 exam seating plans - IMPORTANT

Students have been asked in tutorial to collect their exam seating plan. If you have not done so yet, go the Exams Office upstairs in the Sports Centre. **You will need your college ID and your timetable/seating plan to get into your exams!**

Library Book Returns for A2 Students

All A2 students who have books on loan will receive an email from the Library detailing the items they need to return to college. **Please check your college email regularly!**

- Drop off your books to the library as early as you can - hand them in to the main **Library Desk**.
- There will be two dedicated book return days in the Library on **Tuesday 27th June and Wednesday 28th June**.
- We encourage you to return the books before these dates, as soon as you have finished an exam and no longer need them!
- After 28th June, we will re-check your library account. **It is important that you have returned all items to the college.** You will need to have a clear library account for Finance to process the return of the £50 deposit which was paid when you joined BHASVIC.
- Please note: deposits will be returned to parents/carers' accounts unless otherwise notified.
