Dear Students, Parents and Carers,

Ofsted Inspection

Many thanks to all students, parents and carers who contributed to our Ofsted inspection last week. We are not able to formally share any grades until the report is published, but I can say that we are extremely pleased with the provisional feedback we have received and look forward to sharing the report in the New Year. The Lead Inspector did let us know that we received very high numbers of student and parent/carer responses to the Ofsted surveys, including in excess of 800 written comments from students. We are incredibly grateful to all those who responded to the survey, which helped ensure that all experiences and perspectives informed the inspectors' evaluation and report.

Train Strikes

We are monitoring the impact of the Train Strikes on attendance. BHASVIC Provision is fundamentally an inperson, onsite offer and any other model of delivery (for example, attending lessons remotely) leads to a significant reduction in quality of experience and learning, not only for practical courses, but theory-based subjects as well. We ask, therefore, for students to make every effort to find a way to get into college. We will continue to monitor the levels of disruption caused by strikes and evaluate whether we will ultimately need to move to a blended model (where that is possible) for the minority of students who have no other option but to miss college.

Summer 2023 Exams Arrangements

Ofqual, the exams regulator, has written an <u>open letter to students</u>, and an <u>open letter to schools and</u> <u>colleges</u> about next summer's exams. The most pertinent point to pass on is that Ofqual, the DfE and Exam Boards recognise that the 2023 cohort still deserves some protection against the impact of the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. The details of what will be put in place can be found in the letters, and we will be communicating these details to students at a course-by-course level, through our teachers, so that students fully understand. This paragraph illustrates for all stakeholders what the intention and its general impact would be: "Broadly speaking this means that a typical student who would have achieved, for example, an A grade in A level geography before the pandemic will be just as likely to get an A next summer, even if their performance in the assessments is a little weaker in 2023 than it would have been before the pandemic."
