A1 Parents and Carers 'Specialist Applications' event: Wednesday 3 May

Following on from our HE Info Evenings earlier this term, our **Specialist Applications Evening** will take place on site for parents and carers of students who have chosen a different pathway to UCAS. A1 Study Leave: 2-12 May

A1 students are on study leave from Tuesday 2 May – Friday 12 May. All exam schedules are available to students, via MyBHASVIC App, on Student Advantage, under Exams and Assessments/Exam Statement of Entry. Students are scheduled to receive their results on Thursday 15 June. Predicted grades and progression to the second year will be partly based on these results, so revision over Easter is important. There is one chance for re-sits on 20/21 June and re-sit results are released on 28 June. Guidance Managers can answer any questions about progression criteria from A1 to A2 and will be available to support students following resits.

A2 Study Leave: begins 15 May

Second year students will be on study leave from Monday 15 May, with a Leavers' Event, organised by the Student Union, taking place on Friday 12 May – more details to follow after Easter.

A1 Progression Week: 22-27 May

This week is for all first-year students, when normal timetable is suspended to enable all students to make progress investigating their preferred next steps after BHASVIC. For all students there will be timetabled activities starting on the Monday, with a combination of in-person and online sessions, which students are expected to attend. Progression Week activities vary depending on which tutorial pathway students have chosen for next year (Visual Arts, Employability and Enterprise, Oxbridge (early applications), Medical Careers (early applications), or UCAS) and students will be given more precise details in tutorials early next term.

Skills Week (including Careers Enrichment day): 3-7 July

We have previously communicated about BHASVIC Skills Week, which includes Careers Enrichment Day on 6 July. <u>Don't forget to book your place</u>, via BHASVLE for Careers Enrichment day, in addition to registering your work experience, volunteering or social action placement on the Connect app. The booking systems will remain open over the Easter break. Citizens UK Assembly - Thursday 20 April

BHASVIC is part of Citizens Brighton and Hove, the largest network of civil society institutions across the city. Last month, students helped to launch the Citizens manifesto highlighting key areas that prospective councillors should focus on in the run up to the election (see more here Brighton & Hove Citizens Manifesto launch (bhasvic.ac.uk) Sixth form students from across the city also held an Assembly specifically to lobby those in charge around transport issues in the city (cost, reliability, safety), which is a key part of the manifesto.

The alliance, including BHASVIC students, will now put forward these proposals to the main candidates running for election in May. The assembly takes place on **Thursday 20 April** 18:30-20:30 at St John the Evangelist Church, Knoyle Road, Brighton BN1 6RB.
