The creative sector receives government funding

In recognition of the large contribution to the UK economy, £20m government investment has been received by the UK creative industry, part of which will be used to create a Creative Careers Programme to highlight employment opportunities within the sector to schools and colleges. A new report entitled 'Growing the UK's Creative Industries' from the Creative Industries Federation was published in December. According to the report, one in eight UK enterprises are creative enterprises, which are collectively responsible for two million jobs

Neurodiversity

Recruiter have reported on research conducted entitled 'The UK's Forgotten Neurodiversity' which refers to Autism, Asperger's Syndrome and Dyslexia; Epilepsy, OCD and ADHD are also included, The report found that 76% of managers are not aware of neurodiversity or how to support those with cognitive differences. More encouragingly, 90% of respondents believed that cognitive diversity could help their organisations to succeed.

• Flexible Working

Employers are be encouraged, in a new Government campaign, to offer flexible working in their job advertisements. The number of employees using formal flexible working arrangements has flatlined since 2010 according to a new CIPD report 'Megatrends: Flexible Working'. Although many people are benefitting from flexible working already, there is a significant proportion of the workforce who are not offered this opportunity. The CIPD are working with the government and other stakeholders as part of a Flexible Working Taskforce to raise awareness of the benefits of flexible working to employers and to boost flexible working across the UK

• Jobs for former Amex House Development Project

Amex House in Brighton is to be redeveloped into a mixed-use combination of offices, coffee shops and restaurants. The construction phase, which is due to start in May 2019, is being run by McLaren and will require over 1,000 staff during the build and up to 2,000 jobs are thought to be supported on completion

New Urban Village Plans for Hove

Plans are under consideration for a new urban village in Hove. Mova Living and Apache Capital Partners wish to transform an area near Hove station, which includes a large retirement complex. If Brighton and Hove City Council approve the scheme then it is stated that 500 jobs will be created as well as 90 apprenticeships and work placements

• Brighton Hippodrome Site

A new spa hotel could be coming to Brighton if plans are granted, as well as the refurbishment of the Hippodrome, which has stood empty for over 10 years

• Temporary Customer Service Opportunities

120 temporary customer service agents are required by Rullion Engineering, based in Brighton Marina, to help with customer queries whilst the Brighton mainline undergoes engineering works this month
