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Welcome to this Introductory Widening Participation (WP) Newsletter

The BHASVIC WP team would like to take this opportunity to introduce themselves and to provide you with details of some of the exciting opportunities available to students in our WP cohort. It has been a busy start to the year, students have been settling in to a new environment and becoming familiar with their courses and we hope that they have had a positive start to their College experience.

This newsletter is intended to summarise the main activities currently being offered by our local universities whilst also informing you of other opportunities that may be appropriate. Most events are free of charge but where there is a cost implication, it will have been highlighted. It is important to check eligibility criteria for each activity as this will vary from scheme to scheme. Apologies for the length of this newsletter - it is packed full of information!

Important notice: BHASVIC Futures Fair will be taking place on Thursday 23rd January 2020. This is the main careers event in the BHASVIC calendar. There will be over 90 representatives from national and local employers as well as universities, apprenticeship providers and gap year organisations. All students are encouraged to attend this event and parents/carers are also welcome. Further details will be on the parent page of the website in January.

WHAT IS WIDENING PARTICIPATION - WHO WE ARE, WHAT WE DO AND HOW TO FIND US....

The aim of Widening Participation (WP) is to offer additional information and support to students from groups who are currently under-represented in Higher Education in the UK (e.g., first in the immediate family to consider university, specific post codes and a variety of other factors). Each university has their own criteria.

We work closely with our local partners (the Universities of Brighton, and Sussex and Into University), to offer a programme that is designed to help WP students explore their future options, make informed choices and develop their full potential.

Lynne Trower is a Careers Advisor and BHASVIC's Widening Participation Coordinator. She can advise on the support available to students who are eligible for activities. Lynne has knowledge of WP offers being made by other universities, and is happy to signpost students to these. Being a part of our WP cohort, and registering for any scheme, does not place any obligation on a student to apply to university.

The programme is simply intended to support students to make informed choices about their options when they leave BHASVIC, including investigating the possibility of moving on to university level study. Engaging in the scheme does not commit a young person to making a university application, or to applying to any specific university.

Welcome to BHASVIC Widening Participation (WP)

Through this newsletter you will receive information from the Student Services team on a regular basis. We provide details of upcoming opportunities from external providers (often from universities or organisations offering taster days) as well as careers information and suggestions to help students make better informed decisions.



Launch Events

It was lovely to see so many of you at our recent launch events at BHASVIC and the University of Sussex. We hope that you found these useful and now have a clearer idea of what the Widening Participation scheme can offer. As stated at the event, we simply wish to support each young person to make the most appropriate choice for them; this may be university, but it could also be

progression to employment or an apprenticeship. Whatever route a student chooses they will gain useful information and be guided by the Student Services team.

Registration

We have identified eligible students via the survey that they completed during the summer; it was part of their summer work and this has also given us the ability to signpost students to various support services. If a student has been identified as eligible then we have informed them directly of how to register for each scheme but have also sent an email to their parents/carers. The schemes that students need to register for are listed below:



• Students who are eligible for the University of Brighton will have had their details sent directly to the university (if they gave us permission to share their information; those who did not give permission will not receive information from the university).

- Students we believe are eligible to register for the University of Sussex scheme will have been sent this link First Generation Scholars Scheme. If the registration process is not completed then it will not be possible for a student to take part in WP activities.
- If a student is eligible for the Into University programme then they need to complete a form, this can be collected from Student Services reception. If you are not registered for Into University yet then please check the criteria below to see if you are eligible.

If you meet one of these:

- Free school or college meals (in the last 6 years)
- Living in social housing
- Income less than £25,000

Or two of these:

- Young carer
- Special educational needs
- English as an additional language
- First generation to go to university
- Challenging behaviour at school (previously suspended or excluded)

Please call in to Student Services to pick up an application form for Into University if you think you are eligible.

Many activities are offered during the early part of the year so it is beneficial to register as soon as possible. The universities will set a registration deadline and after this they will not take new students. Please do not miss the opportunities being offered by failing to register. We will continue to send the newsletter to you until the deadline has passed, after which time we will assume that you do not want to be included in the scheme.

You will receive information directly from the universities to confirm your application has been successful. Please contact them with application queries.

Inclusion in Activities

If a student is successful in applying to any activity they must check with their teachers that it is OK for them to attend, (this only applies if the event is in college time and will result in them missing college to attend). Once they have done this, they must notify our attendance team and the WP team - this can be done by emailing outofcollege@bhasvic.ac.uk and copying in wp@bhasvic.ac.uk.

Ongoing support

If a student requires support regarding WP they can make an appointment with Lynne via the front desk in Student Services.


PwC are launching their work experience programmes for 2020 in November 2019. Students will need to be:

Career in Property

Every day we are influenced by the built environment around us – shops, offices, industrial buildings, houses and the surrounding countryside all have an impact on the way we live. Did you ever wonder how these properties are developed, whether the buildings going up in our cities are sustainable or how much they are worth? Join the Pathways to Property Open Online Course (OOC for short!) to learn about the property industry and the exciting careers within.



The OOC has been designed by leading academics at Henley Business School, University of Reading for students in secondary education. Taking place over three weeks and requiring six hours of study, the OOC is completely **free to complete** and runs fully online. During the course, learners will be able to ask for support from course mentors; a combination of academics and industry volunteers. Sutton Trust US Programme – Study in the US

What is it?

The Sutton Trust US Programme is an 18 month-long programme for talented year 12 students from across the UK. It includes two residentials in London to help participants explore US study, before all 150 students spend a week doing the programme's summer school at US universities (last year they stayed at MIT or Yale), during which time they visited a number of other universities in the US. As the students go into year 13, if they want to apply for US universities alongside their UCAS options, the Sutton Trust will support them, their families and their colleges with the application process, including further UK residentials.

How much does it cost for the students?

The programme is free for students – including travel, food, accommodation, admissions test preparation and more.

Who are we looking for?

The Sutton trust select 150 students to take part each year.

These students will:

- Currently be in Year 12 at a state school or college
- Not hold US citizenship
- Be from a low income family (generally, this will mean a household earning £45,000 or less)

The Sutton trust are looking for applicants that meet all or most of these criteria:

- Have achieved at least eight GCSEs at grade A or 7
- Show a commitment to the programme and interest in US culture and higher education
- Have a strong college reference

Individuals from a broad range of ethnic, religious and socio-economic backgrounds are encouraged to apply.

LSE Student Shadowing

Student Shadowing provides a unique opportunity for Year 12 and 13 students from schools and colleges in the UK to gain an insight into studying at LSE. Students spend half a day at LSE shadowing an undergraduate student.

As part of the day, they will:

- attend an undergraduate lecture
- have a tour of the campus
- quiz students on their university life



Students also have the opportunity to speak to someone from Student Marketing and Recruitment with any queries or concerns they have about admissions and other aspects of studying at LSE. In 2017/18, over 500 students took part in LSE's Student Shadowing Scheme and it runs from October to March each year and applications are now open for 2019/20. FREE Access Programme for Y12 students at the University of Oxford

UNIQ was previously a standalone summer school but has been expanded to include a Spring Conference and a digital learning portal enabling up to 2000 students to take part. The programmes are academically intensive and challenging but also a lot of fun. Importantly, every programme run by UNIQ is completely free of charge; the University covers all accommodation, food and travel expenses and any associated academic or social activity costs. A great many previous participants have gone on to make successful applications to Oxford, Cambridge and other Russell Group universities.

UNIQ is open to applications from UK state college students in their first year of further education. Detailed eligibility and selection criteria can be found HERE. By taking part, UNIQ participants:

- Have studied at a non-selective state secondary school.
- Currently attend a non-fee paying sixth form or college.
- Have a minimum of 5 grades at A*, 9, 8 or 7 at GCSE.
- Currently be studying at least two Science Technology, Engineering or Maths (STEM) subjects at A level.
