Southampton University Experience Engineering - What is Experience Engineering?

15 - 17 April 2020

Experience Engineering is a free residential course for Year 12 students interested in studying engineering at university. The residential will introduce students to the areas of Ship Science, Mechanical Engineering and Acoustical Engineering.

Over three days, students will design, build and test a Green power car and a fast craft for water. They will also capture, explore and synthesize acoustic environments as part of a team. These projects allow the participants a chance to undertake research whilst developing essential key skills. Staff and students from the Faculty of Engineering and Physical Sciences will provide talks, workshops and seminars within their subject areas.

What does the course include?

- Experience teaching within engineering subjects
- Explore campus life and university accommodation
- Discover student life
- Learn from engineering academics
- View world class facilities
- Improve skills such as team building, critical thinking
- Aid in the decision making for a University course
- Travel reimbursement up to £80



Eligibility

This is a free course for Year 12 students. To be eligible participants must be under the age of 18 at the time of the summer school, and meet the following academic criteria:

- Have achieved at least five A/ A*s at GCSE
- Are taking relevant subjects in relation to engineering (e.g. Maths, Physics and other Science subjects)

and meet at least two of the following Widening Participation criteria:

- In the first generation of your immediate family to apply to Higher Education
- Current home postcode shows that you live in an area with low levels of progression to Higher Education. (Postcodes within the lowest two (1 &2) POLAR4 young participation quintile). Postcodes can be checked for eligibility on the OfS Postcode Checker.

• or current home postcode falls within the lowest 20 per cent of the Index of Multiple Deprivation (Check postcode), or a member of a travelling family.

- Attended a school/college whose performance places it into the lowest two quintiles
 for average QCA points per A level student (or equivalent) (in England, Wales or
 Northern Ireland) as identified by the Department for Education dataset and provided
 to the University via UCAS. A list of schools/colleges meeting this criteria can be
 found under useful downloads in the document 'Eligible schools for applications
 made in 2018/19'.
- In receipt of a 16-19 bursary or similar grant OR received Free School Meals at any point during your school education
- Living or grew up in Local Authority care
- Are a Young Carer

Southampton University Widening Access to Medicine Residential (BM6) 6-8 April 2020

The University of Southampton is running a 3-day Easter residential for thirty Year 12 students, designed to increase the applicant's knowledge of the role of doctors and the training they undergo. The residential will provide opportunities to develop interpersonal skills, increase awareness of the undergraduate medical student experience and support students in their applications to study Medicine. University of Bath - Discover Bath Residentials



What is Discover Bath? Discover Bath are on-campus residential summer schools which will give students a taste of first year study at the University of Bath. During the stay on campus students will take part in a series of first-year undergraduate lectures, workshops and projects (including laboratory experiments during our Science and Engineering summer schools).

Discover Bath summer schools run in:

- Science Tues 30 June to Fri 3 July
- Engineering Tues 30 June to Fri 3 July
- Social Sciences Mon 6 to Thur 9 July
- Management & Business Mon 6 to Thur 9 July

Students who meet our widening participation criteria (click here) will receive a subsidised free-of-charge place on Discover Bath, which will include accommodation, food and travel costs to and from the University.

You should note that online applications are now open. Before attending you will complete some pre-work to help you to prepare for Discover Bath, and this will typically include subject-related reading materials. The deadline for applications is **Sunday 1st March 2020**.

University of York - Next Step York





Next Step York provides talented Year 12 students with the opportunity to participate in a programme of activity that will support their application to a research intensive university like the University of York.

Students on the Next Step York programme will take part in a series of activities throughout Year 12 and 13. The activities have been carefully developed to help participants reach their full academic potential. They will also attend a five-day residential at the University of York campus. Free Taster Course
Programme with Various
London Universities
(non residential)

The Taster Course Programme provides year 12 sixth form students with a taste of what life at a university in London is like. Through your chosen taster course you will experience the different teaching methods used by university academics and gain an insight into the additional facilities available, whilst meeting students from across the UK.

All our taster courses are free to attend and students can choose a course from a variety of subjects taking place at the numerous participating universities. Courses range from voice and drama, to medicine and nursing, to computing and business.

The taster courses take place at various times throughout the year but mainly between February and July. The courses run from half-a-day to a week and are non-residential. All courses are free of charge, students are responsible for their own travel and food expenses, however students claiming a bursary at BHASVIC may be eligible to support with travel.

The courses offer an insight into study at university and the opportunity of attending a course that may be of interest to students who are not sure about at this stage. The experience will also enable students to check out the non-teaching facilities provided by the university. There will be a chance to meet with other students on the taster course and undergraduate students studying at the university. These are great experiences to help with decision-making and with completing personal statements.

Access UCL Scheme

Access UCL is UCL's alternative offer scheme for students from groups that are underrepresented at UCL.

Eligible students who successfully complete the Access UCL scheme will receive a reduced offer of up to two grades below the standard UCL offer for the programme they have applied for.

In order to be eligible for the scheme students must be attending/have attended a UK state school for A levels/IB Diploma and meet two out of the following criteria (please note that this eligibility criteria is for students applying in 2019/20 for 2020 entry):

- Attend or have attended a low-performing school for either GCSE or A level*.
- Live in an area which has a high level of financial, social or economic deprivation**.
- Live in a neighbourhood which has a low progression rate to higher education***.

If students are eligible for Access UCL there is no need to do anything in addition to the standard UCAS application, the application will be automatically flagged when we receive it.

NOTES

- * This means your school falls into the lower 50% of schools in England and Wales for average GCSE achievement and/or average A-level point score
- ** The Index of Multiple of Deprivation (IMD) data is used to identify levels of financial, social or economic deprivation, as defined by home postcode click here.
- *** POLAR classification is used to look at how likely young people are to participate in HE across the UK, as defined by home postcode click here.
