Remember all the way back in June you completed an assignment telling your tutor any additional information that can be added to your application

Extenuating Circumstances and Disrupted Study Supporting Information

We have now added your subject reference information

This will be added by General Office to your application before it is sent so we need to make sure that the information is correct, you are happy with it and it includes everything we need to tell universities.

Reminder: This might include

- Young Carers
- Improved predicted grades compared to GCSE (with short explanation)
- ALS and reasonable adjustments that have been made by BHASVIC e.g. Extra Time
- Illness and disabilities
- Bereavements
- Home circumstances
- Staffing challenges

- Challenges with study skills and the support BHASVIC has put in place
- Home schooling
- Widening Participation if known
 - Low GCSE score secondary school (Hove Park, PACA, BACA, Longhill, Seahaven, PCS, Robert Woodward, Littlehampton Academy)
- Care-experienced

Supporting Info

The third section is for supporting info about you.

This will mainly be positive information from your subject references which will show how you are ready for university level education.

It will also include info from Skills Week (this will need an update), Careers enrichment day, mentoring, student ambassador, clubs & societies and outside college (e.g. part-time work, extra/super-curricular) that will also support your uni application.

Important note:

- There will be a gap between your application, taking your exams and finishing BHASVIC.
- It might be that during that time something happens that it would be helpful that your uni choices should be aware of.
- This might be home circumstances, health or a variety of other important issues.
- Talk to your tutor and GM. We can still write to unis to make them aware.

Remember:

- You should have declared health conditions and status as young carer, care-experienced, WP and more on your UCAS form.
- You will talk about activities in support of your application in your personal statement
- This info is about how circumstances have impacted and possibly how college has helped.











- Your tutor has completed your Reference and you will need to check it off and agree both.
- IMPORTANT PREDICTED GRADES: IF YOU FEEL THAT THEY SHOULD BE DIFFERENT YOU MUST TALK TO YOUR TEACHER AND LET YOUR TUTOR KNOW. TEACHERS CANNOT UPDATE ON THE SYSTEM ONLY TUTORS.
- ONCE YOU HAVE CHECKED AND AGREED THEM AND YOUR APPLICATION HAS BEEN SENT TO UCAS WE DO NOT CONTACT UNIVERSITIES TO INFORM THEM THEY HAVE CHANGED LATER ON.








 Ensure we make the best use of the limited number of characters available

To look at some tips for improving our written work

Making every character matter

- You have limited space when writing your personal statement questions.
- You can write up to 4,000 characters of text across the 3 questions
 that shows you'd make a great student it may take a few redrafts
 until you're happy with it.
- Cutting out those extra words is important and does take thought.
- Don't forget others can check it for you don't be afraid to ask.

Activity #1

Talking about studying A levels in Maths & Physics

 How can we cut this down so it reads (and sounds) better?

 You have the example on your table – see what extra words you can cut out to make it read better. The study of mathematical sciences has managed to intrigue me for very many years. Drama has inspired me to succeed in my education and I enjoy both the practical and academic aspect of study.

Note the improved emphasis on academic study

- Try to use up all your characters it is all evidence to support your application
- Re-read, re-write and get someone else to check your statement we all get 'word-blindness' to mistakes in our own written work
- Not going to Uni? the same skills are needed in other situations writing a supporting statement to a job application for example
