Assessment Arrangements if exams in Summer 2022 are cancelled

At BHASVIC, we are very carefully formulating our contingency arrangements for Teacher Assessed Grades should summer 2022 exams have to be cancelled again by the government. Cancellation of exams is extremely unlikely. However, we want to ensure that the contingency arrangements we put in place will meet government requirements but, very crucially, we want the assessments we put in place to support our students with their final exams.

We do not want to ask our students to do unnecessary assessment activity which does not support their learning. We also do not want to unnecessarily reduce the amount of lessons to conduct extra, contingency assessments. Basically, we will formulate the very best, most supportive and educationally sound approach which meets requirements in a reasonable way and enables us to celebrate our student achievement and promote their wellbeing.

Our arrangements will be published in full to all our students, parents and carers before Christmas and via email and our <u>FAQs</u> webpage. No formal assessments will be taking place until well into the Spring Term. Our advice right now to all our students and their parents and carers is to focus on your learning, the advice and feedback from your teacher about your progress and enjoyment of your deepening skills and knowledge; also, to look forward to a break over the Christmas Holidays. In the upcoming Parents and Carers consultations, talk to your teachers about your progress and what to do next. Try to avoid spending precious time with your teacher on worrying about assessment contingency arrangements and avoid spending energy on worrying – we've got this for you and we'll do well by you. We know our students, want the best for them and we know how best to do that in these circumstances

And finally...We have been asked to promote the following message to our parent/carer networks

Have you left your career in the NHS or Social Care? Get back to what you love and come and re-join your Health or Social Care team – it is easier than you think.
