X	Excel: The Big 5! of Microsoft Excel - skills that you NEED to be a spreadsheet whiz in any office/accounting/data analysis role In a databased workplace (logistics, office admin work, data analysis etc) being a whizz at Excel is extremely valuable, and there are so many workers out there who do not know how to work efficiently and quickly with spreadsheets. I learned these skills in a job that I hated, and yet these skills have stuck with me and impressed time and time again wherever I go. Cut through the talk and rhetoric, and analyse the data for yourself i.e. adopt an evidence-based approach. Just like at work, in this activity you are going to be given reports full of numbers about student and teacher performance, and your job (yes, it is a job) is to build a workable spreadsheet that summarises this data into something meaningful. In the process, you will learn how to perform VLOOKUP, SUMIF, COUNTIF, nested if, LEFT/RIGHT, unique identifiers and more. Number of Places: 15

The business side of acting and everything you need to know to get started	So you Want to be an Actor and Learn How to Fight The first half of the workshop will focus on audition technique with a focus on finding your authentic voice, exploring style and developing your audition technique. Run by actor, Annie Sutton, she will lead you through a series of workshop activities to really help you hone your performance techniques. Annie has worked extensively in the theatre and is a very experienced workshop leader. There will be opportunity to ask questions about working in the industry and what it is really like to work as a jobbing actor/director. The second part of the workshop will introduce you to stage fighting and violence from the Brighton based Action Emporium – A well-executed fight scene can make stage combat look easy – but, much like dancing, it must be intricately choreographed and extensively rehearsed to provide that authentic feel while remaining safe. A significant amount of entertainment relies on characters sustaining injuries. As teachers, injury is something anathema to our professional interests, but many a play requires some form of violence – be it a comical slap or a full-blown battle scene. The challenge at such moments is always how to make the fight look exciting and real without any of the actors actually getting a black eye. A good stage fights need to have martial or character logic, they need to have a story arc, they need to work for an audience and, most importantly, be safe and repeatable.
