What is Widening Participation?

- Widening Participation is a scheme to widen access to university for under-represented groups for example home postcode, Free School Meals, household income, young carer etc.
- Universities across the UK offer:
- 1) information, advice and guidance
- 2) activities
- **3) support to help students to make an informed choice** about their options.
- There is no regular commitment to being part of this scheme. You do not have to apply to university as part of this scheme.

Why have you been selected to be part of the Widening Participation Scheme?

- Students have been selected based on information entered on the form or CEDAR record
- BHASVIC then compared the answers you gave to the criteria of partner universities.
- You will have received an email from <u>wp@bhasvic.ac.uk</u> with sign up details for these partner schemes and your eligibility.

What are the benefits of being part Widening Participation? Access to taster days, summer schools and activities that will help you make the right decision for you.

Possibility of reduced grade offers from some universities (sometimes participation is required).

Depending on your financial situation, there may be bursaries available.

Transition support to university e.g. settling in to your course.

Additional individual support e.g. for personal statements.

Make sure you sign up for our partner universities' schemes

Look at the WP Teams for upcoming events

Read the WP newsletter (once a term) If you decide to apply to university, check websites for information on WP – criteria will vary depending on the university. You may not be eligible for all WP schemes. How do you get the most from the scheme?

What universities and organisations do we work with?

- We ask students to enrol with our local partner universities (Brighton, Sussex and Into University) so that you can take advantage of accessible events and taster sessions.
- We work with many other universities, and it is important that you research your chosen institutions for their WP (outreach) offers.
- The more engaged you are with the information and the activities on offer, the better informed you will be when making decisions. The universities will now tell you more about the opportunities they offer.














