Who are we?

Arts Emergency provides young people with free mentoring, advice, guidance and opportunities to help them embark on higher education and careers in the creative sector.

We're looking for young people aged 16-25 who are passionate about the arts, humanities or creative industries and who would benefit from having a mentor in these areas. We match you and your mentor based on your individual interests, passions and goals.

How we can help you

We can set you up with a mentor who shares your interests. They will support you in monthly meetings for 12 months by helping you set goals, giving you advice and providing you with opportunities to explore your passions. This could look like UCAS guidance, CV writing, exhibition/studio visits and much more!

We will continue to support you until your 26th birthday. This can be through work experience, paid opportunities, access to creative professionals, free tickets or advice and guidance.

How to get a mentor

Apply for the programme! To apply to our programme you will need to first check the eligibility criteria to make sure we can accept your application.Then fill in our online form, which can be found on our website. Use the url below or scan the QR code on the other side of this flyer. When you apply, select that you are applying through a partner school. Applications close on October 6th 2021.



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The UCL's Access and Widening Participation team offers an exciting range of visits, events and programmes for students in years 5–13 and adult learners who are underrepresented in higher education. There are also activities run for parents and carers.

All of the events and activities are designed to give students a greater insight into UCL's degree programmes and student life. UCL also seek to raise the aspirations of students from groups who are under-represented at university.

The events and activities are funded by UCL's Access and Participation Plan and Widening Participation funds. As such, there are eligibility criteria that all applicants should consider before applying.



EPS Futures

The University of Birmingham recently launched EPS Futures, a fully funded foundation year providing mixed science and maths curriculum allowing progression to a range of subsequent three or four year engineering and physical science degrees. The year is fully funded covering both tuition fees and accommodation costs and entry requirements are much lower than our usual courses, around CCC.

The pathway has been created to support students from disadvantaged backgrounds so they must meet certain criteria to apply.

York Access Scheme 2022/23

The York Access Scheme aims to provide a fair chance of getting into the University of York. It gives you the opportunity to let us know about any circumstances that may affect your progression to a university like York.

We are committed to widening access to York particularly for applicants from backgrounds that are underrepresented in higher education. Our ambition is to work together to promote a more equal, diverse and inclusive society.

By providing us with more detailed information about your background than you provided on your UCAS form, you could receive additional consideration from our admissions assessors and a contextual offer offer up to two grades below the typical offer. You could also access an enhanced support package that will help you to meet other offer holders and prepare for the exciting transition to university life.

At the University of Greenwich, we are very fortunate to have the STAART initiative which supports disabled (including specific learning difficulties and mental health conditions) students from outreach through to employment and postgraduate study. The scheme is unique in the UK and students do not require any medical and/or psychological evidence to join us.

This initiative supports prospective and current students who have a disability; long-term health condition; specific learning difficulty; and/or mental health condition. Our support mechanisms prepare students for the reality of university for disabled students.

The STAART Team is a disability and diversity focused initiative at the University of Greenwich that was developed in partnership with Aimhigher. They provide information and guidance to disabled and diverse students who may not feel university is for them, or who have concerns about going to university. The team started in 2007 and continues to develop to meet the requirements of disabled and diverse students.

What do we mean by 'disability and diversity'? Disability and diversity includes the following:

- A mental-health condition such as anxiety or depression
- A specific learning difficulty such as dyslexia or dyspraxia
- A developmental disorder such as autism or ADHD/ADD
- A progressive medical condition such as Multiple Sclerosis, Cancer or HIV
- A sensory impairment which could affect the ability to see or hear
