Widening Participation

This exists to improve social mobility from under-represented groups in higher-education. Many universities have different criteria - see the document to the right for more details (although you may like to do your own research).

You may be listed as a student on our WP scheme for a variety of reasons. This could be home postcode, care experienced, household income, free college meals or a variety of other reasons.

We cover WP and your apply form in the lunchtime apply sessions so don't worry if you don't yet know how to enter it on your form. Use it though!

Our Support Service

The PDF documents above list many universities and their schemes and bursaries. You can search for any uni WP criteria (and the benefits) by searching for example 'bristol uni widening participation'.

They should list bursaries / reduced grade offers.

What are Contextual Offers?

Sometimes it's called contextual admissions, are defined by UCAS as 'where the university considers any barriers you may face, and will either reduce grade requirements or give extra consideration when deciding whether to give you an offer.' This can include guaranteed interviews and/or bursary funds linked to WP status. Some universities take into account whether a student has participated in their Widening Participation access programme or summer school when making a contextual offer. You will need to add this to your UCAS application and if you require further information, contact the university's admissions department directly.

Online and in-person activities are delivered by both university staff and student ambassadors. We can work with you to tailor our programme to suit your students. UPDATES AT PARTNER UNIVERSITIES

Access Programme



The University of Sussex Access Programme offers students support, guidance and experiences to help navigate their post-16 education options. It aims to help you make more informed choices about your future, and the steps you need to take to get there. The programme is completely free, and offers you all the tools you might need in one place, allowing you to shape your own journey.

Access Plus

Students who meet our more targeted criteria will be able to sign up to additional events as part of our Access Plus Programme. Our Access Plus Programme entry criteria includes students who:

- are from areas identified as a low participation neighbourhood or areas with indicators of deprivation (we will check your postcode for you once we've received your application)
- are in receipt of free school meals, school or college bursary
- are a care experienced young person
- are a young carer
- have a disability, learning difficulty or mental health condition
- are from Gypsy, Roma and Traveller communities
- are a refugee or an asylum seeker
- are a service child
- are estranged from their family
- are a mature student

After signing up to our Access Programme, we will assess whether or not you are eligible to access the additional resources and events on our Access Plus Programme.

Ignite Your Journey

At the University of Southampton, we take a lifecycle approach to Widening Participation and Social Mobility. Our flagship programme Ignite Southampton allows us to offer sustained and sequential support to students from groups under-represented in higher education.

Programme overview

Participants will take part in a number of activities to develop skills and knowledge around university level study, and help with their transition to HE.

Online learning module: You will complete an online learning module to prepare you for university and help develop some of the key skills needed for higher education.

Virtual Q&A sessions: We will host monthly live Q&As to connect you with experts on topics related to your journey to university.

E-mentoring: You will be matched with a current University of Southampton student who will be able to share their experience of university life and answer your questions.

Personal development opportunities: We will offer a range of opportunities which will focus on transferable skills to get you thinking about your employability and personal development.

On campus activities: We will offer you travel bursaries of up to £100 to enable Ignite your Journey students to attend one of the University's Autumn Open Days and/or an Applicant visit day, where appropriate. All participants will also attend a Transition and Skills event in April of Year 13 which will consolidate your online learning.

Summer School 15-17 July

The USW and Reaching Wider Summer School returns this July with a programme of exciting activities to give students a taste of life as an undergraduate student. Summer School will provide students with an authentic experience of university life. Along with two night's accommodation in our residential halls and series of social activities, students will have the chance to participate in subject-specific workshops and HE information, advice and guidance sessions. Students will also have the opportunity to connect with like-minded students from other schools and colleges, and meet our enthusiastic team of student ambassadors to get an insight into student life at USW.

Places will be allocated to Year 12 and Level 3 (Year 1) school and college students, however numbers are limited and priority will be given to students from groups currently under-represented in higher education, who meet one of the eligibility criteria detailed below and as per the University's 2023-24 Fee and Access Plan. **There is no charge to attend** the Summer School, accommodation and meals are included and we can also support with the cost of transport to attend.

Students who participate in the Summer School and enrol on a full-time 3 or 4 year undergraduate degree course in September 2025, will be eligible for the USW Summer School Bursary, worth £500.

- Have their work included as part of an industry-standard art exhibition at AUB's The Gallery.
- Be invited, alongside friends and family, to attend a celebration event of their work.
- Receive one-to-one support from expert artists and designers in the development of their portfolio.
- Attend a 'transition to creative HE' event in their second year of sixth form or college.
- Be given extra consideration at the point of admission to AUB, which, if an offer is made, will be a reduced conditional offer of up to two grades.
- Support from a dedicated progression mentor through the AUB application process and beyond.

CareerDays.co.uk is for any student aged 13-18 who wants to experience different careers or gain work experience in their chosen field. From medicine, law, performing arts, psychology, business or becoming a vet, we have a 1-day online event for you, designed to give you an insight into life in your chosen field.

We have bursaries available for UK and International students to enable them to attend our courses without charge or at a reduced cost. There are 400 free places available for those students requiring financial help if you are based in the UK.

In order for you to qualify you must meet **three** of the following criteria:

- Attending a publicly funded school or college
- Receive free school meals
- Be on track or have attained a minimum of 5 A* - B GCSE's
- First in their family to attend university
- Either parents in receipt of either Jobseeker's Allowance, Universal Credit or Income support.

Due to the large amount of applications for bursaries we receive, we may not be able to give you an individual response but we will be in touch if you are successful.

This university offers engineering courses to non-maths students and is accredited by Kings College London.

We recognise that choosing to study a degree is a big decision, and how to fund your studies is a big part of that decision. We want you to understand the full range of options and opportunities available to you if you choose to study at TEDI-London.

TEDI-London Financial Support Arrangements

At TEDI-London we will award bursaries to students if they come from a low-income family. This can help students who may face more barriers to attending full-time education, enabling them to access a degree at TEDI-London. The Student Hub can support students experiencing financial difficulties. We can check that you are receiving all the funding and benefits you are entitled to.

Please note that you will only receive one bursary, even if you are eligible for more than one.

TEDI-London Access Bursary

If your household income is less than £35,000 a year, and you meet the eligibility criteria outlined below, you will automatically be awarded a bursary of up to £2,000 for every year of your course. This is not a loan: it is a gift from TEDI-London that does not have to be repaid and you can use the money for anything you want.
