

WELCOME BACK TO THE LATEST WP NEWS

Welcome to the latest edition of our newsletter. Now we are in the spring term let us draw your attention to lots of new opportunities, including summer schools and work experiences.

Please remember to check each programme's eligibility criteria before applying. The Widening Participation scheme is here to support students and their progression in whatever subject area and via whatever route (university or apprenticeships) they choose.

The **Sussex Inspires programme** is a key central hub with a range of resources so we encourage students to sign up for this – there is no expectation that you will apply to the **University of Sussex**. The **University of Brighton's Outreach programme** is equally useful with the added benefit of offering a bursary called 'Brighton Boost' and this programme will complement many of the subject areas offered by the University of Sussex; students are able to register for both without obligation.

Some of the deadline dates are fast approaching so it is advisable to read/skim to see which programmes are closing in the coming weeks. UCAS Pathway - How widening participation can help to remove barriers to higher education

In the coming months, our first year students will be choosing their pathway for the second year tutorial programme. As well as the WP Teams page and the information given in this newsletter, there is a whole section dedicated to further information about widening participation on SharePoint called **Welcome to the UCAS Pathway**. Students have access to view these slides and presentations and it will help them understand:

- Bursaries and scholarships
- Contextual offers

Widening Participation

This exists to improve social mobility from under-represented groups in higher-education. Many universities have different criteria - see the document to the right for more details (although you may like to do your own research).

You may be listed as a student on our WP scheme for a variety of reasons. This could be home postcode, care experienced, household income, free college meals or a variety of other reasons.

We cover WP and your apply form in the lunchtime apply sessions so don't worry if you don't yet know how to enter it on your form. Use it though!

The PDF documents above list many universities and their schemes and bursaries. You can search for any uni WP criteria (and the benefits) by searching for example 'bristol uni widening participation'.

They should list bursaries / reduced grade offers.

What are Contextual Offers?

Sometimes called contextual admissions, these are defined by UCAS as '*where the university considers any barriers you may face, and will either reduce grade requirements or give extra consideration when deciding whether to give you an offer.*' This can include guaranteed interviews, mentoring and/or bursary funds linked to WP status. Some universities take into account whether a student has participated in their Widening Participation access programme or summer school when making a contextual offer. You will need to add this to your UCAS application and if you require further information, contact the university's admissions department directly.

Use the Sutton Trust Tool to see which universities give contextual offers against WP criteria.

Outreach Programme



From the University of Brighton website:

Online and in-person activities are delivered by both university staff and student ambassadors. We can work with you to tailor our programme to suit your students. We are also developing more and more resources for students, parents, carers and practitioners using a variety of online platforms that allows users to work at their own pace, revisiting videos when they need.

Post-16 activities are open to all students, with priority booking for partner sixth forms and colleges, and students who are part of the University of Brighton Outreach programme.

Brighton Boost (2026)

Eligible students can also access the Brighton Boost, offering up to £1,000 for accommodation or £700 for travel, alongside support such as part-time job opportunities, essentials support, laptop loans, and free campus parking; eligibility can be checked using the [postcode checker online](#):

- + up to £1,000 to help with halls accommodation costs, or
- + up to £700 to help with the cost of commuting to uni



Student Travel Bursary

Do you need travel support to attend one of our applicant events? Students can apply for funding for travel to events and trips that support their awareness and understanding of education options through the Sussex Learning Network UniConnect fund. They can apply for travel funding for themselves and a parent, carer or guardian.

To be eligible to apply, they need to be:

- + in year 10 or above in the academic year 2025-2026
- + studying in a Sussex state school, 6th form or further education college
- + eligible for free school meals, now or in the past

Into University



Students who are applying to Oxford or Cambridge this year, whether for an undergraduate course or a Foundation Year, they may be eligible for an extensive package of virtual support, including:

- Feedback on their Personal Statement
- Advice on preparing for Admissions Tests and Assessments
- Interview Preparation
- Pastoral support
- Signposting to other resources and opportunities

Explore Oxbridge takes place after school, mostly online. Students without access to a computer at home can arrange to use one at their local IntoUniversity Centre. As with our other programmes, students must meet the [IntoUniversity eligibility criteria](#) to take part and because the programme takes place mainly online, there is no limit to the number of students who can participate, nor is there a minimum number.

Explore Oxbridge is a five-year programme that students can join at any time from year 9 until 13 and is designed to help students develop their:

- Critical thinking
- Oracy skills
- GCSE knowledge
- Intellectual curiosity
- Knowledge of courses on offer
- Preparation to apply to competitive universities, particularly Oxford and Cambridge

Discover Bath

Discover Bath is a summer programme which aims to give prospective students a taste of first-year life and study at the University of Bath.

Discover Bath is fully subsidised by the University of Bath (this means that you won't need to pay to attend), including on-campus accommodation, free meals for the duration of your stay, a programme of academic sessions (lectures, seminars, workshops) and fun social activities. Your travel to the University can be reimbursed (reasonable travel within the UK only).

Discover Bath is available to all Year 12 (or equivalent) students who are academically able to study at Bath in their chosen subject and meet our widening participation criteria.

If you do not meet our widening participation criteria then unfortunately you won't be eligible for Discover Bath but you may wish to consider our **Step into Bath** residential instead.

National Access Summer School

The National Access Summer School (NASS) is a four-day residential programme for Year 12 students from across the UK.

The programme offers an insight into the university experience, including taster lectures covering various academic subjects, a chance to live in university accommodation and exciting new social experiences.

Applications for NASS 2026 open on Monday 2 February 2026.

NASS supports students from underrepresented backgrounds in higher education by teaching them more about university-level study and student life. The programme is for those who study at a state school or college and meet other eligibility criteria.

For you to be able to participate in NASS, your school or college must be signed up as a P2B partner. A teacher at school/college (usually a Head of Sixth Form or Head of Year) will be able to confirm if your school is a P2B partner. If your school is not a P2B partner, but you think you may be eligible for NASS, please email nass@contacts.bham.ac.uk for more information.

- Duration: 4 days and 3 nights
- **Dates: Monday 20 July - Thursday 23 July 2026**
- Location: University of Birmingham campus and accommodation

Your immersive campus experience will start with staying in the university halls of residence for the duration of the summer school.

During the day, you will attend academic sessions focused on an area of your interest, and during the evenings, you will get the chance to take part in social activities. You'll also get to take a tour of Birmingham, the UK's second city. Throughout the residential, an experienced team of current undergraduate student ambassadors will be on hand to support you.

After the summer school, you will be supported with a period of e-mentoring from an undergraduate student from the University.

Insight into Bristol

Tuesday 28th - Friday 31st July 2026.

The deadline for applications is Monday 9th March 8am.

About the programme

Participants in the summer school will get the opportunity to experience student life at the University of Bristol by:

- staying in student accommodation
- meeting similar students from across the UK
- exploring the City of Bristol
- attending academic sessions in an assigned subject stream delivered by our world-leading academics
- getting to know current University of Bristol students, including some of our student societies
- taking part in social activities throughout the week
- receiving information, advice and guidance to equip you to navigate to a top UK university

The summer school will take place on the University of Bristol campus with accommodation provided.

Guaranteed contextual offer

If you successfully complete the Insight Into Bristol scheme, and depending on the course(s) that you choose to apply for, you may be eligible for a guaranteed contextual offer or interview to study at Bristol provided you meet the contextual entry requirements for that course.

For courses that do not routinely interview as part of the admissions process, you will be guaranteed a contextual offer (typically two A-Level grades below standard entry requirements) to study at Bristol provided you are studying any specified A-Level subjects and meet any additional requirements for your chosen course. Applicants must still complete any admissions tests such as the UCAT/ LNAT/ SAQ (and score above a threshold) in order to receive the guaranteed offer/ guaranteed interview.

For courses that require an interview as part of the admissions process, such as Medicine or Dentistry, you will be guaranteed an interview for that course provided you are predicted to meet or exceed the contextual entry requirements for that course; you meet any GCSE or equivalent requirements; and you have completed any relevant aptitude test such as the UCAT (and scored above a threshold) by the appropriate deadline. Following interview, you may be made an offer at the contextual level.

This benefit can apply to multiple courses should you choose to submit multiple course applications to Bristol.

SMBP Wise (Work Experience)



Each year, SMBP runs Work Insight and Skills Experience (WISE) Weeks – immersive programmes designed to give students aged 16-18 a real taste of the working world. Over the course of one week, students visit 5 different high-profile organisations to take part in interactive, hands-on activities, spend a day at a professional sports club learning about the psychology of resilience, work in teams to solve business-like challenges, build key workplace skills, and explore career paths they may never have considered before. In addition to in-person programmes, SMBP also runs a National Online Week, designed for students who live in more rural areas or cannot attend in-person sessions. This virtual experience is hosted live by a different business each day, offering the same high-quality insight and skills development as the in-person programme.

In-person WISE Week – is a **five-day programme delivered in specific UK locations**, where students visit multiple businesses and a professional sports organisation in person. Participants take part in practical, interactive activities, meet professionals face-to-face, and experience real workplace environments, helping them build confidence, understand different careers, and develop key employability skills. Lunch is provided each day, and travel costs are covered. [Details are here](#)

Virtual Programme – our National Online WISE Week delivers the same core careers insight and skills development through live, interactive online sessions hosted by four high-profile business partners across the week, with the final day spent developing resilience and goal planning skills through the SMBP App. It removes the need for travel, making it accessible to students regardless of location or circumstances, while still offering exposure to a range of industries, professional role models, and workplace skills in a virtual format. 

Each year, students who are part of the WP programme are invited to attend various trips including open day events at regional universities.

On 14 January 2026, 12 students from Criminology department were invited to come along to Sussex police HQ in Lewes. The trip was linked to their current unit on Policing, bringing classroom learning into real-world application and potential progression routes. After an introduction from PC Keith Berkley about the force, the students were introduced to both operational and uniformed job and also civilian roles in following departments:

- CSI and forensic investigation with demonstrations on fingerprint removal, PPE and DNA samples

- IT
- Traffic Officers
- Firearms Officers with a visit the force's armoury
- Recruitment and the application process

This was an exciting opportunity to see what happens behind the scenes at the police HQ and we were all grateful for the chance to see how different department work.

ASU London financial support arrangements

At ASU London, we will award bursaries to 'home' students if they come from a low-income family. This can help students who may face more barriers to attending full-time education, enabling them to access a degree at ASU London.
